# ORDER GRANTING PETITION FOR WAIVER

(Issued and Effective October 10, 2007)

# BY THE COMMISSION:

## **INTRODUCTION**

On May 8, 2007, the City of New York, filed a petition for waiver of the deadline for completion of the public comment process required by the Commission's rules relative to cable television franchising.

## PUBLIC NOTICE

The waiver of a rule is subject to the State Administrative Procedure Act and, accordingly, a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was published in the State Register on June 13, 2007. No comments have been received.

## BACKGROUND

The request seeks a waiver of 16 NYCRR Section 891.2(b)(2), which provides that a municipality shall commence a process, which affords the public in the franchise area, appropriate notice and participation for the purpose of reviewing the performance of the cable company during the current franchise term. The rule provides that the public comment process must be completed on or before the first day of the fifteenth month prior to the expiration date of the franchise.

The petition also seeks a waiver of the comment period deadline because the City Charter requires a public hearing and public comments prior to a final vote by the Franchise and Concession Review Committee (FCRC) on franchise renewals.

### **DISCUSSION**

The City of New York wishes to waive the deadline for receiving public comment on the proposed franchise to afford the large, diverse population in the City additional time to attend public meetings on the franchise and offer comments. In addition, the City must follow its own Charter to provide a public hearing and receive comments before a vote by the FCRC.

In light of the large, diverse population of the City and City's concern about getting up-to-date information from residents before approving cable television franchises, it is in the public interest to allow a waiver of 16 NYCRR Section 891.2(b)(2) to allow additional time for public comments and to meet the requirements of the City Charter. Accordingly, the waiver is approved under Public Service Law, Section 216(1) and 216(5).

#### The Commission orders:

1. Pursuant to Sections 216(1) and 216(5) of the Public Service Law, the petition of the City of New York for waiver of 16 NYCRR Section 891.2(b)(2) is hereby granted.

2. This proceeding is closed.
