CASE 03-V-0053 - Petition of Mid-Hudson Cablevision for Approval
of the Renewal of its Cable Television Franchise
With the Town of New Baltimore, Greene County.
Amendment.

ORDER APPROVING AMENDMENT

(Issued and Effective August 29, 2007)

BY THE COMMISSION:

The above-captioned application was submitted by the
Town of New Baltimore, Greene County on May 23, 2007. A copy of
the same was served on Mid-Hudson Cablevision, Inc. and all
local notice requirements have been met. No comments or
objections have been received.

This application is governed by Section 222 of the
Public Service Law, which requires our approval unless we find
specific violations of law, Commission regulations or the public
interest. Section 222(4) of the statute provides that we may
approve the amendment contingent upon compliance with standards
or conditions consistent with the public interest. Having
reviewed this application in the context of applicable statutory
and regulatory standards, we have determined to approve it.

This application seeks our approval of an amendment to
the existing cable television franchise agreement between the
Town of New Baltimore and Mid-Hudson Cablevision, Inc. by

resolution of the Town Board dated May 14, 2007 after a duly noticed public hearing held on the same date.

The amendment would increase the franchise fee Mid-Hudson Cablevision, Inc. will pay from 3% to 5% of gross monthly revenue received from the provision of recurring cable services to subscribers.

Part 892 of the Commission's rules establishes the procedures to be followed for approval of amendments to any cable television franchise. We find the instant application and its contents are in compliance with our rules, regulations and statutory requirements. Moreover, we have not received any comments in opposition to the amendment proposed herein and the public interest will not be harmed. Finally, the increase in franchise fees sought under the amendment is within the 5% cap under federal law.

Accordingly, Section 5 of the existing franchise agreement will be amended in accordance with this order. No other section of the franchise agreement will be modified. Pursuant to the terms of the existing agreement, the Franchisee will now pay a 5% franchise fee to the Town on an annual basis.

The Commission orders:

1. Pursuant to Section 222 of the Public Service Law and the rules and regulations of this Commission, the application of The Town of New Baltimore, Greene County for an amendment to the cable television franchise with Mid-Hudson Cablevision, Inc. is hereby approved.

2. This order does not in any way confer rights or privileges other than those granted in the underlying franchise and the certificate holder remains subject to the obligations imposed by Article 11 of the Public Service Law, the underlying

franchise and all applicable rules, regulations and orders of this Commission.

3. This proceeding is closed.
